#### Example 2: Bucket 2 - Buy Low, Sell High

One logical way to combine my particular interest with my skill is by selling real estate. I chose Bucket 2, so now I'll narrow that down and decide to flip houses. I make the initial investment, renovate the home, and then resell for a higher price.
